Jeff began his career at the University of Kansas where he received a B.S. in Remote Sensing and Geographic Information Systems. He was a Distinguished Graduate from the ROTC program and received a commission into the US Air Force. As a 2Lt, Jeff served as a Nuclear Launch Officer on strategic alert at Grand Forks AFB, ND. He moved on to become the Chief of Orbital Operations for the Milstar satellite constellation with the 4th Space Operations Squadron at Schriever AFB in Colorado. In this capacity, Jeff managed the repositioning of a spacecraft to a new operating position in the Pacific Theater. He also provided guidance on geosynchronous satellite slot allocation to the Joint Chiefs, the State Department and the United Nations. He has worked in the commercial space industry for Digital Globe, a company that provides satellite imagery to Google Maps. His recent career selection took him to the remote location of Antarctica where he managed a facility responsible for providing off-continent communication for the National Science Foundation. Jeff has lived on 4 continents and traveled on all 7. He is a Florida Ironman finisher and currently lives in Golden, CO where he spends his time river kayaking and skiing.



tion, this tour was the first time that the band has performed internationally, [including] the Montreux Jazz Festival, one of the premier jazz festivals in the world," says band leader Mitch Biba, who plays trumpet and flugelhorn and is a member of the Rotary Club of Wisconsin Rapids.

By staying in Rotarians' homes, band members got a true taste of other cultures and formed new friendships, he adds.

The only Rotarian in the band, Biba says he got the idea for a jazz tour to benefit PolioPlus while leading a District 6250 Group Study Exchange team to the Philippines in 2009.

"I met Les Wilson [Rotary Club of Maghull & Aughton, England], team leader for a District 1180 GSE in the Philippines at the same time. One of our discussions included his district's fundraising dance for polio eradication," Biba says.

During the discussion, they decided to "make this crazy idea a full-fledged tour."

Biba is hopeful the band will raise an additional \$15,000 for the challenge.

And there are seven regional offices in Argentina, Australia, Brazil, India, Japan, Korea, and Switzerland. Together with the headquarters in the United States, they are available to serve not only Rotary International but also The Rotary Foundation.

Another part of The Rotary Foundation awareness is the sharing of information outside our organization. We are a group of leaders with a superb network. It is time for us to let the world know about all good things that we have accomplished over so many years. Rotarians have the opportunity to create – and must create – awareness regarding world problems and how they can be solved by Building Communities – Bridging Continents through Service Above Self.
