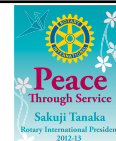

We participated in a fantastic joint project with the Rotary Club of Kingston Jamaica providing water coolers in several schools throughout Kingston and incorporating the ideals of Rotary in the project by way of installing the Rotary 4 Way test sign at each school. (5) New Generations Service New Generations Service recognizes the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities such as Rotaract and Interact club service projects, and creating international understanding with Rotary Youth Exchange.
